## Organization Plan 3: Argument Proposing a Surprising Causes or Consequence

Introduce the issue and state your claim.

- Engage reader's interest in your causal issue and show why it is problematic or controversial.
- · Show what's at stake.
- · State your claim.

Reject commonly assumed causes or consequences.

- Describe the first commonly assumed cause or consequence and show why you don't think the explanation is adequate.
- Continue with the rest of your commonly assumed causes or consequences.

Argue for your surprising cause or consequence.

- Describe your surprising cause or consequence.
- · Explain your causal reasoning.
- Anticipate and respond to possible objections if needed.

Conclude.

- Perhaps sum up your argument.
- · Return to the "big picture" of what's at stake.
- End with something memorable.
