You should think of your audience and be clear about how much work you need to do to persuade that audience.

Your proposal argument will consist of

- the statement of a problem
- the solution to the problem
- the justification of your solution
 - argue from principles or category
 - argue from consequences
 - argue from resemblance
- the handling of counterarguments
 - bridge
 - refute
 - concede

Consider adding a visual argument. (What are your goals; what can a visual argument add?)

Your proposal should last from 5-7 minutes, and you'll hand in your notes at the end. Put everybody's name on the notes.
